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Everyone has Heroes in their life, people that they look up to and respect, people that set a good example for others to follow. Heroes can be real people whose achievements inspire us, or they can be fictional characters whose actions and adventures represent values that we admire.

The word Hero comes from the ancient Greek word 'Heroes', which literally means "Protector" or "Defender". Today the word Hero is commonly used to mean 'a person of great courage, ability or strength who is admired for their great deeds and noble qualities' (dictionary.com).

Heroes exist in all kinds of stories, including novels, films, comic books, and even in news reports, biographies and autobiographies.
